

#### **Financial Disclosures – Signature Required**

Thank you for choosing our practice! We are committed to the success of your medical treatment and care. We are certain you already understand that the prompt payment of any balances due on your account is part of this treatment and care. Because there are literally hundreds of health plan options available, it is commonly accepted that understanding and clarifying all benefits and exclusions under your health plan is ultimately your responsibility.

However, we would like to help make the process of paying for your care as easy and painless as we can. For your convenience, below are answers to a variety of commonly asked financial policy questions. ## Do I Have To Pay My Co-Pay Or Account Balance At The Time of My Visit?

Yes. The administrative costs of collecting your co-pay and/or balance while you are in the office are quite low in comparison to the high cost of sending and processing statements. For this reason, the staff in the front office is challenged regularly with identifying and collecting any co-pays or balances due upon arrival of any patient presenting in any office for medical care. It is a "necessary evil" and we appreciate your understanding of your need to pay in full at the time of your visit.

## I Am A Prospective New Patient. What Do I Need To Know?

New patients must pay a \$50 deposit toward their visit in order to make an appointment. This fee is non-refundable for "self-pay" patients and is applied toward any deductible and/or co-insurance for insured patients. Any credit balance can be applied toward future visits or refunded upon request. We regret that we are unable to book patients who decline this policy.

## I Am An Existing Patient. What Do I Need To Know?

Existing patients do not have to pay a deposit in order to make an appointment. However, payment of any balances or coinsurance are expected on the day of service and appointments that are not cancelled within 24 hours of the appointment date/time are subject to a non-refundable \$50 fee. Patients with a pattern of no-shows may be dismissed from the practice.

## Can I Setup My Account For AutoPay?

Yes. For your convenience, and subject to your written authorization, we can automatically charge your credit card. This will be done each month before statements are run. Upon request, any patient who wishes can still receive a detailed statement.

## **Do I Need A Referral?**

If you have an HMO plan with which we are contracted, you need a referral authorization from your primary care physician. If we have not received an authorization prior to your arrival at the office, you have the option of being rescheduled or paying for the cost of the visit and submitting for reimbursement through your insurance.

# **Office Visits and Office Services**

<b>Commercial Insurance</b> Also known as indemnity, "regular" insurance, or a certain % split between patients and insurance companies.	For payment of the patient responsibility for all office visits, x-ray, injection, and other charges. This is required at the time of the office visit. <b>If you have an individual policy, you will</b> <b>need to make sure premiums are paid and</b> <b>coverage can be verified at the time of</b> <b>service.</b>	Call your insurance company ahead of time to determine deductibles and coinsurance. File an insurance claim as a courtesy to you.
HMO & PPO plans with which we have a contract <u>HMO Medical Groups:</u>	If the services you receive are covered by the plan: All applicable co-pays and deductibles are required at the time of the office visit. If the services you receive are not covered by the plan: Payment in full is required at the time of the visit.	Call your insurance company ahead of time to determine co-pays, deductibles, and non-covered services for you. File an insurance claim on your behalf.
<b>HMO with which we</b> are <u>not contracted</u> . Must have authorization	<b>If authorization is in place:</b> All applicable copays and deductibles are required at the time of the office visit.	Call your insurance company ahead of time to determine co-pays, deductibles, and non-covered services for you. File an insurance claim on your behalf.
Point of Service Plan or Out Of Network PPO	For payment of the patient responsibility— deductible, co-pay, non-covered services. This is required at the time of the visit.	Call your insurance company ahead of time to determine out of network benefits, co-pays, deductibles, and non-covered services.
Medicare	If you have Regular Medicare and have not met your deductible. This is required at the time of the office visit. Any service not covered by Medicare; payment is required at the time of the visit. If you have Regular Medicare as primary, and also have secondary insurance or Medi- <u>Cal</u> : No payment is necessary at the time of the visit unless the secondary does not pay in full what the primary insurance does not. If you have Regular Medicare as primary, but no secondary insurance: Payment of your co-pay is required at the time of the visit.	File an insurance claim on your behalf. File the claim on your behalf, as well as any claims to your secondary insurance.
No Insurance	A non-refundable charge of \$50 to a credit card is required to secure your appointment. Payment in full of remaining fees is due at the time of the visit.	Work with you to settle your account. Please ask to speak with the Billing Office staff if you need assistance.
